



Summary of Optional Comments (generated by ChatGPT)

Students express a mixed perspective on the use of ChatGPT in academic settings. Students expressed concerns about allowing the tool for assignments, arguing that it hampers creativity in writing and stifles original opinions. They believe that relying on ChatGPT detracts from the learning experience and could negatively impact students' development as writers and thinkers.
