Strategies to integrate AI

Require Context: Tie in with lecture/course material/textbook/additional material (Galileo)

Include Metacognitive Reflection: Life experiences, background for selection of topic, process for idea development

Technology integration: Document progress (scaffolding w/Google Docs), drafts, video articulation.

Multimedia assignments: Summary of video

Prompt documentation: Students will include list of prompts used



AI Ethics & Policies







We found evidence of bias in our models via running the SEAT (<u>May et al, 2019</u>) and the Winogender (<u>Rudinger et al, 2018</u>) benchmarks. Together, these benchmarks consist of 7 tests that measure whether models contain implicit biases when applied to gendered names, regional names, and some stereotypes.

For example, we found that our models more strongly associate (a) European American names with positive sentiment, when compared to African American names, and (b) negative stereotypes with black women.
