

- Participation depends on background, skills, and life experiences
- Lurking behavior
- Dominated by opinion messages
- Lack of research-based posts



#### Discussion Rubric

- Time based
- Report on research
- Original thought
- Evidence of Leadership
- Holistic scoring

#### Case Studies

- Pioneered by the Harvard Business School
- Theoretical knowledge tested with "real life" situation
- Higher retention of learning
- Encourages collaborative work
- Explores different perspective and "out of the box" thinking
- No one "right" answer. Instructor serves as a guide
- Generates new ideas not found in books which can be used in research articles



## Case Study Example [ABED 6120]

#### Assignment:

Note: This assignment is slightly different from what we have been doing in previous weeks. You will find current information for this assignment on websites, not journals. So it is okay to use websites as references to support your recommendations.

I) You have just been employed as an Administrative manager in a new company that is a small business with 15 employees. The company supplies machine parts to engineering companies and consists of small engineering, sales, and marketing departments. There is no accounting and human resources department because these functions are handled by the founder himself. The payroll is currently outsourced to another company and there is no current benefit plan for employees.

To remain competitive and retain employees, the founder of the company is interested in setting up a 401K/IRA type retirement plan and has tasked you with researching these plans that he can offer to all employees in the company.

Provide the following answers:

In your proposal to the founder of the company....

Which plan(s) would you offer to employees? Why did you select the plan(s)? Will you offer a company match? What were some other plan(s) that you considered but rejected? How will this plan benefit the employer and the employee? Finally, which company will you choose to administer this plan?

(Note: No copying/pasting information directly from websites. Provide a concise description of the plans in your own words, and analysis to support your views. Do cite proper references. Do not concern yourself with other benefits such as Medical, Dental etc.)

## Next Steps..

- Review Discussions/Research Paper
- Select student(s) and send invitation
- Get Approval (in writing!)
- Identify journal
- Re-purpose paper for journal (edit)
- Send query letter
- Submit article to editor
- Wait, hope, pray....



#### Benefits to student

- Gets students involved with research
- Encourages writing
- Peer review
- Boosts self-confidence
- Builds collaborative teamwork
- Mastery of technology (e.g. wiki)
- Use of similar techniques in their own professional practice



## Benefits to faculty

- Encourages student-faculty research collaboration – beyond the classroom
- Motivates students
- Division of labor (time, effort)
- Identifies new research streams
- Promotion & Tenure
